# **ETIQUETTE OF THE GAME OF GOLF**

Much has been written on golf etiquette, including in the rule book. The underlying reasons for good etiquette being necessary in the game of golf are to promote:

- Fairness
- Safety
- Courtesy and Respect for Others
- Responsibility in Caring for the Course

#### 1. General Considerations

#### Always:-

- Keep still and silent when a partner is playing a shot.
- Turn off your mobile phone or switch to silent.
- Allow green-keeping staff right of way.
- ➤ Take precautions not to harm yourself or others playing golf.
- Repair divots and pitch marks.
- Rake bunkers and leave rakes in flat areas of bunkers pointing in the direction of play.

#### 2. On the Tee

- Be ready to play or play "ready golf" (see also Pace of Play).
- Use sand provided to repair tee shot divots.

### 3. On the Putting Green

- Avoid walking on a fellow player's intended putting line.
- Repair any pitch marks or accidental damage to greens.
- ➤ Do not scratch a "V" on the green to indicate where the NTP marker should go. (Use a ball marker.)
- > Do not stand behind or in front of another player's line of putt or cast a shadow on his/her line of putt.
- Remain on or close to the putting green until all other players have holed out, then hurry to the next tee to mark the card.

## 4. Pace of Play

- > Be ready to play when it is your shot.
- Do not make too many practice swings.

- > Put your club away or mark the score card when others are playing a shot.
- ➤ Play a provisional ball if your ball may be lost and use a watch to make sure three minutes isn't exceeded when searching for a ball.
- Keep up with the group ahead.
- > Allow faster groups to play through.

#### 5. Carts

- > Keep your cart on the designated path whenever possible.
- > Don't drive near greens.
- ➤ Always avoid wet areas, even if not roped off or marked.
- After you play a shot do not put your club in your golf bag. Hop in the cart and put your club away when the cart stops for the next shot.
- ➤ However do not move the cart or drive ahead while someone is playing a shot nearby.
- ➤ If you are the driver of the cart consider your passenger at all times.
